TIPS FOR BETTER FISHING IN 1993

The open water fishing season for 1993 is here. Many anglers have said that 1992 was not their best year for fishing success. Unstable weather conditions had something to do with that, but we can't do anything about weather. However we can do something about the way we deal with the various conditions Mother Nature throws at us.

Following are some of the things we can do to increase our chances for success when the fish aren't cooperating:

DON'T FISH MEMORIES.

Just because you caught fish on a particular point last year, don't assume they'll be there now.

BE WILLING TO CHANGE FISH SPECIES.

Sure, walleyes are fun to catch, but sometimes it's just tough to get them to open their mouth. When this happens, go after bass, northerns, or panfish. Usually, their's one species of fish willing to bite, and it's lot more fun to catch a bunch of bass, then not catch any walleyes.

TRY ANOTHER BODY OF WATER.

Along those same lines, if you want to catch walleyes and they're not going, move. Sometimes rivers will be better than lakes, and sometimes a small lake with stained water will outproduce a large one with clear water. Keep moving until fish are found. DON'T GET STUCK ON ONE LURE OR ONE COLOR.

Be versatile and experiment until the fish reveal what they want. Maybe the walleyes were smacking yellow jigs last week. Their lure and color preference will change from day to day, and even hour to hour.

TRY NEW BODIES OF WATER.

Some of us get stuck on the same body of water every time we go out. It's fun to try new bodies of water, and it's also a learning experience. The more we learn, the more successful we'll be.

USE LIVE BAIT.

If fish are finicky, a leech, minnow, or crawler wiggling on a Roach Rig, jig, or below a slip-bobber, will frequently be what it takes to get them interested. A plastic worm on a jig

head is a great bass bait, but a jig and minnow will often be gobbled by a large and smallmouth bass while a jig and worm combo is ignored. TRY NEW SPOTS AN YOUR **FAVORITE BODY OF** WATER.

Sometimes we fly by a good location to get to another one. I know some people who live on a large body of water and they only fish five or six spots. There are plenty of other good structures that hold fish, but they only work those areas. If there are fish

there, they catch them, if not, they go home with an empty livewell. Some spots will produce when other's won't and the more spots we try, the better our odds for action.

MOST IMPORTANTLY, EXPERIMENT.

If you've never tried crankbaits for walleyes, make this the year to do so. If northern pike sound interesting, go after them. Do something different in your fishing this year, and I'll bet you find your success will increase.


