CLEAR LAKE UPDATE

The ice is gone. We are again back to soft water fishing. The lake came through the winter in excellent shape. To my knowledge there was no fishkill this year. There were some reports of a super sunfish bite just before ice out. They were so aggressive that the bobber never got a chance to settle on the water. This year's walleye opener should be great. There will be plenty of two to three pound fish this year, since none were caught this winter. People reported seeing them down their holes, but could not get them to bite. Maybe they will

get hunger once the water warms later this spring. The signs have been picked up, only a couple of them were lost this year. We had no problem with people breaking them off this year. I think anglers are starting to realize the signs are there for their protection.


Our thanks to Brett Merkel for supplying us with that beautiful salmon at the last meeting, and to all who contributed fish and prepared it, our "Hats Off".
