Clear Lake Update

Fishing season has opened and all we need now is some warm weather to make it feel like it really has. The opener went pretty good on Clear Lake, some anglers had success, others didn't. The water is very clear, which will make walleye fishing success difficult. The fishing pier has been repaired and reinforced, so hopefully there will be no more problems. One area where we are still having problems is the aeration lines. Another one popped to the surface last month. Before we got there to sink it again it was hit and severed by a boat. The line that is floating has been coiled up and marked with several buoys. The other end has stayed submerged and will have to be located. There is about 500 feet of line that will have to be sunk again once it is reconnected. The

RECIPE-OF-THE-MONTH

(1) 105 ton Blue or Sulfur Bottom Whale7326 lbs. potatoes2276 lbs. carrots104 lbs. salt

1896 lbs. onions 1406 gals. tomato sauce 927 lbs. celery 76 lbs. black pepper

Place Whale in pot with tomato sauce, salt, pepper and Tabasco Sauce. Cook at 300° for 3 days. Add onions, potatoes, carrots and celery. Simmer for 36 hours. Serves 347,161.

This spring, it was one thing after another going wrong with the club boat. When it was taken out of storage, we discovered that the tarp has a severe rot problem. When I took the tires off to have them replaced, I discovered that the wheel bearings were bad. The next time we used it we found a major gas leak in the line going to the fuel pump. To top it all off the drain plug threads stripped and would no longer keep water from entering the boat. Thanks to donations by several of our members, we are back in business. Doug Saville, from Brown County Tire, donated two new tires and tubes. Marv's Sport Center donated a used tarp that fits the boat almost like it was made for it. Carp Fishing Contest in June

It's all set, the first weekend in June, the biggest carp fishing contest in Brown County. Registration will start at 6:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 1st. The contest will run until 2:00 p.m. on Saturday, with final weigh in at 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 2nd. Entry is \$10 per person, with two people per boat. Payback will be 100%, half for biggest fish and half for the most pounds caught. Carp may be taken by archery, spear or rod and reel. The contest will be held rain or shine. There will be a lunch wagon at the contest site. We hope to see you all there.

Camouflaged Fish?

Did you ever wonder why fish have white bellies and dark-colored backs? The white undersides of fish make them more difficult to spot when viewed from below, and their dark backs blend in with the bottom when they are viewed from above. Walleyes and other minnow-eating game fish have eyes near the top of their heads. This means they see out and up better than down or under their heads. Minnows tend to school above game fish, so nature evolved the predators' eyes to better see their prey; and of course, the prey developed camouflage.
