

Stocking Myth Exposed

"Stock more so that we can catch more" is a persistent myth about fisheries. Most anglers believe that by adding fish, the fishing will get better. In reality, without an unfilled niche, added fish either die or displace other fish. A recent study by the Birginia Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Research Unit demonstrates the limits of stocking. For 11 years, biologists monitored the results of stocking striped bass in Smith Mountain Reservoir, Virginia. The reservoir contained ample pelagic prey, but no pelagic predator. Stripers were introduced to occupy an apparențly open nitch. Stocking was successful, and anglers eagerly sought these large gamefish. Average annual survival rate of age -1 and older stripers was 40 percent. An average of 21 percent of stocked fingerlings survived their first year, although annual survival rate varied between 4 and 54 percent. Researchers found that the percentage of juvenile survivors decreased as the number stocked increased beyond minimum level. Based on these results, stocking 200,000 fingerlings would provide as many 1-yearold stripers as stocking 620,000. Once the reservoir's capacity to feed juvenile striped bass was reached, more could not survive. More milk can't be poured into an already full bottle. Nevertheless, the public continues to ask for stocking solutions to most fisheries problems. Money and manpower for fishery management are wasted by the myth of easy cures through stocking.
