

## Clear Lake Update

The fish houses are on the lake, but I think we are going to be walking out for most of the winter. All the rain and snow has turned the lake into a big slush pond. The snow has also caused another problem for the lake. By not allowing sunlight to penetrate the ice, oxygen levels in the lake have become severly depleted. The oxygen has dropped into the critical area, but is slowly recovering. The aeration systems has been running since shortly after Christmas and seems to be doing job, but we seem to have two lines that are frozen. Despite all our efforts, we have not been able to get them operating. We will keep trying to get the lines open and have the system running more efficiently before too long. As for fishing on Clear Lake, I really couldn't tell you first hand, as I have not yet been able to get out there. I would imagine, thouth, with the low oxygen, that the fishing would not be too good. I have noticed though, there are a few other houses out beside

ours. Hopefully once the oxygen rebounds, and I get a chance to get out, the fishing will improve. I would like to thank the guys who came out and helped us get the houses on the lake. It was hard work as we did not have an easy time getting them on the



lake. Again, thanks guys. 'Til next month, good fishing!


The boats are rigged and the guys know where to take you to put on the fish for the time of the year that you plan on going.

## January Meeting




