TIP LINE

tricks of the trade in fishing

Here's a trick for fixing a backlashed baitcasting reel:
Before picking at the snarles, tighten the drag. Then
place your thumb tightly on the birdsnest and turn the
handle slowly, causing the wraps to turn under your
thumb's pressure. This will straighten most of the line,
making it easier to pick out the remaining tangles.

Choose a hook based on the fish you're after. For crappies and other soft-mouthed fish, use one of the new, chemically sharpened hooks. They penetrate fast and create a small hole, so fish have a difficult time shaking them. For fish with tough mouths, like most saltwater species and large freshwater gamefish, use hooks with a cutting edge because hooks with a chemically sharpened hooks don't penetrate well through bone.

Tents and sleeping bags will last indefinitely if you dry them thoroughly after use, before putting them away. Rig a pulley and rope in the eaves of your garage or barn and use it to hang tents and sleeping bags up out of the way until they are completely dry before folding them for storage.

PRO will furnish some volunteers to help with the picnic before we fish and will remain to assist us as well. The group will be about 30 kids and should be a great time.

You can take pride in the years to come that you helped reduced sediment loading downstream and provided a natural area for Minnesotan's to enjoy shore fishing and much, much more. In the future we will take a look at how we can further encourage angling at these two spots and make them a user friendly as possible.

SOMETIMES, PATIENCE STINKS

Not only does the fishing stink, the lake itself stinks. A combination of dead fish, feedlot runoff, and possibly contamination by a septic system has given Clear Lake a rather unpleasant odor. All of the contamination has also caused an explosion of weed growth which has choked the lake earlier than usual. Most of the fish have died, the lake stinks and is full of weeds. What else could possibly go wrong at Clear Lake? Oh yes, the ice this past winter has destroyed the fishing pier. Some fish have managed to survive, how I don't know. Some stocking has been done and more will take place later this summer. Most of the odor will go away on it's own as the dead fish continue to decay. The weeds are something that will take more time to get under control. The bureaucratic wheels have been set in motion. Now we must wait and let it run it's course. As for the fishing pier, I think its time to shoot the horse and bury it. It was a good idea to build it out of recycled plastic, but the first two winter's in the lake have proven that it cannot stand up to the rigors of a Minnesota winter. I believe that the company that built the plastic pier should refund the county's money. Then the county should purchase a pier that is time tested, similar to the one that was installed at Lake Hanska. With all that has happened to the lake in the past year, it will be a while before we will again enjoy quality fishing at Clear Lake. We need to be patient, for good things to happen will take some time.
