get a total kill on the lake before this winter is over. If not, plans are in the works for another restoration. The lake will most likely have to be killed again. This time adjoining waters will also have to be treated to get better control of rough fish populations. If everything can be organized and funding put in place, the lake could be treated yet this coming fall. For now most of the work will be going on behind the scenes. Just because you don't hear or see anything, doesn't mean that we are not working on it. There are a few snags that we will have to maneuver around before a definite plan can be finalized. We have a host of differnet organizations working on this project already and we hope to see the fruits of our labors in the very near future,
