FROM THE PRESIDENT. . .

Don't miss the next meeting, Tom Dixon with the MNDNR out of St. Paul who is an expert on habitat and lifestyles of the not so famous "so called" rough fish populations of Minnesota will be here with a presentation. He has extensive knowledge on fish such as buffalo which is a favorite of mine. So come prepared for questions and bring an open mind; you will be surprised. Also bring a friend to the meeting, we are only as strong as our membership and we always need fresh minds to help with the challenges our club takes

The next meeting of the Minnesota River Public In put Committee will be at the Club house on Wednesday, August 18th. it should prove to be a worth while meeting to attend for all NUASF members. It begins at 7 p.m. and topics will include drainage, both Ag and Urban, as well as progress on signage for tributaries here in the Minnesota River watershed. Stream classification review and a scheduled hearing for it will also be discussed. This is a golden opportunity to have your voice heard by people that make law and rules governing our surface water.

Well, it appears we are at an impass with Clear Lake. Land owners cannot come to an agreement that will allow us to use rotenone on the critical areas of the connecting surface waters that will eliminate the bullhead and carp populations. Subsequently we are faced with the prospect of alternatives. We have made a comittment to the long term fish population management of the lake, which includes aeration. Under the present set of circumstances we will not be able to insure long term reclaimation of the fish population because of the real possibility of early invasion of black bullhead and carp. The money is there to do it. Despite idiotic rumors about not meeting deadlines and other hearsay, the facts are facts. We have the money to use the rotenone, but if we use it without treating those critical areas, we will be pouring our money down the drain, This is extremely distasteful to taxpayers who are footing the bill, remember they don't all fish. And frankly I would do everything in my power to point it out to the public if we were to move ahead without the

This will be discussed at the next meeting and we will try and come up with new ideas.


