Annual Ice Fishing Contest



Editorial from the Mississippi Monitor

In the next few years, residents of the Upper Mississippi River Basin will celebrate an inauspicious anniversary.

We will soon celebrate the 20th anniversary of regional efforts to solve the problems created by too much sediment being washed into the Upper Mississippi.

As backwaters and sloughs filled with sedimient, resource managers worried that the nation's great river would no longer be able to support healthy populations of fish and wildlife.

Now, 20 years later, they're still worried. Little progress has been made. And, many of the same resource managers who worried 20 years ago are still unable to seriously address the problem today.

The reasons are both political and psychological.

The agencies are worried about the impacts of sedimentation - state Departments of Natural Resources, the Corps of Engineers, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service - do not administer programs which could reduce soil loss.

And, the agencies which do not administer programs which can reduce soil loss - the state Departments of Agriculture and the Natural Resources Conservation Service - are not worried about the impacts of sedimentation.

In addition, sedimentation is a regional problem caused by poor land use practices in parts of five states. Resource managers must not only cross state boundaries but also federal jurisdictions - the Corps has three districts in those states and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has two regions.

After years of interagency turf battles, many long-time state resource managers believe the problem is too complicated to be solved.

Better to treat the symptoms rather than the cause, they say, by expanding efforts to dredge backwaters and sloughs that have already filled with sediment. They're also worried that a basin-wide program to address sedimentation would threaten funding for other pet-projects.

But, the basin's private stakeholders aren't ready to give up. Farmers, conservative groups, waterway users, and government officials have developed a plan to address sediment and nutrient loss on a regional scale. After using federal funds to build a basin-wide monitoring network, they would use computer models to identify high priority sub-watersheds and increase federal financial and technical assistance to target those hotspots. Am advisory group of private stakeholders would guide the new program, called the Mississippi River Stewardship Initiative.

After twenty years of failure, maybe it's time to let the people - not the bureaucrats - decide the fate of the nation's great river. They can't do much worse.

Have you moved or has your addressed changed? We need to know in order to stay in touch with you and keep you informed.
