There are some basic human rights issues that need to b raised regarding some of the enforcement tactics and methods used by a few misguic ed officers. Some lessons on "intent of the law" and "letter of the Law" really need t be dealt with by management. Degrees of resources abuse do exist, but you wouldn

### Buffalo Feed tickets



# **Clear Lake Update**


