At the last meeting of the New Ulm Area Sport Fishermen, it was brought up that there was a petition and a request, for group support to ban spearing at Lake Sleepy Eye. The group discussed it extensively. After a very spirited round of talks, we collectively decided to ask for assistance from DNR fisheries before making a group motion. We are asking for your best counsel on long term affects that continued spearing in Lake Sleepy Eye will have. We would like your opinion on both affects to the general fish population and more specifically northern pike. I know it is a lot to ask, but if you could cover all aspects which would include all pro's and con's with regards to enforcement and other cultural intangibles, along with any supporting scientific data that you may have at your disposal. I know that as a NUASF member, this puts you in somewhat of a precarious position, but what are friends for if we can't lean on you a little. I hope you understand and know full well that no matter what your professional counsel is in this matter, it will in now way affect your social relationship with any of us. You are such a highly respected member of the club and very appreciated for your opinions given your years of experience. If you would show this letter to Capt. Randy Evans and get input from him we would also appreciate it. I have preliminarily discussed it with him. We respectfully await your responses.


