## Clear Lake Update

It would appear that winter has finally left us. It was a long, hard winter. Even though we started the aeration system early this year, it seems that we did experience a partial winter kill. Randy Berg, who lives on the lake, took a stroll along the northeast shore and saw crappies and a few bass that had been dead for quite sometime. Let's hope that it was only a partial kill. On the upside, I do believe that Clear Lake was scheduled for some additional stocking this spring.

Clear Lake will be getting a new fishing pier this spring. It will be replacing the one that has given the County so many headaches. We need to thank Orv Rannow for all the work and running he did to get this done. It is being constructed by a local firm and should be in place early this spring. The old pier is still sitting on the beach at the County Park. The Club is now the owner of

that pile of recycled plastic and steel. We have set April 28 at noon as the day and time when we will dismantle the pier and do some cleanup at the lake. We will also be picking up the thin ice signs from wherever they have floated to on the lake. If you can help that day, we can use pickups or trailers to haul the old pier away. Also bring a rake or shovel

to do some cleanup of the swimming beach. It looked pretty bad last fall and the park will get much more use this season. Let's get it looking good right away this spring. We will be hauling the material from the pier to the club grounds that afternoon at which time we will be having lunch.

## Minnesota River Cleanup

We have tentatively set for Saturday, May 5th for our annual riverbank cleanup. Meeting place will be Riverside Park at 8:00 a.m. Gloves and garbage bags will be supplied. Be sure to wear rugged clothing and boots. Of course this is all contingent

on the river being back in it's banks. If it is still out, the clean up will be rescheduled for a later date. In either case, we will be going out to to the club grounds that afternoon to do our annual spring clean up. There are some tree branches that came down during the ice storm and also some raking to do. We will also need to rearrange the fish houses for summer. So either way, we will have something to do that Saturday.

## Sensitivity: Getting the Edge

Most macho bass guys, and weedy trout types, and even grizzled steelheaders or walleye nuts have the same problem: sensitivity.

This has nothing to do with touchy-feely fad from southern California: instead, we're talking about how best to detect the subtle signals of biting fish. Unfortunately, tackle



manufacturers have turned the idea of sensitivity into a modern

snake oil with abundant hype and few specifics. On the plus side, sensivity in fishing is a skill that can be learned. With practice, you will catch more and larger fish. Here's how to start.

### **Sensitivity Defined**


Whether you're fishing a plastic worm deep for bass or drifting a nymph for trout, you're connected to an unseen lure by your fishing line. If the line is slightly taut and the moving lure hits a rock or a stuoomop, you will feel a slight bump. That "feeling" is sensitivity, and it is most dependent on at least slight line tension between you and your lure. If there's a pile of slack line on the surfac above your lure or bait, obviously you won't feel a thig. In spite of th stratospoheric claims made by most tackle companies, even the most expensive rods, reels and lines are not inherently sensitive. You are. And all you basically have to do is concentrate as you fish paying attention to those thumps and to your fingers. More on sensitivity next month.
