
BACK TO DIXON





Carbon Monoxide: The Silent Killer

Do ice fishermen need to be worried about carbon monoxide? You bet they do. The Consumer Products Safety Commission reports that approximately 200 people per year are killed by accidental CO poisoning with a additional 5000 people injured. These deaths and injuries are typically caused by improperly used or malfunctioning equipment. Carbon monoxide inhibits the blood's ability to carry oxygen to body tissues including vital organs such as the heart and brain. Carbon monoxide is a colorless, odorless, tasteteless and toxic gas produced as a by-product of combustion. Any fuel burning appliance, vehicle, tool or other devices has the potential to produce dangerous levels of carbon monoxide gas. Using a portabe gas heater inside a tent, RV, camper, vehicle, shelter or other enclosed area can produce deadly carbon monoxide. Never sleep with a heater on inside any enclosure. Make sure, when ice fishing does start, that your shelter or house is vented to allow fresh air to enter. Let's have a safe ice fishing season.
