
#### Ice fishing trip---filling fast

#### From the President . . .

What a great turnout at our last meeting. It sure makes the case for expansion of our club house. We will need to begin discussions on this at our next meeting. It has been muttered by many of us and now we need to get the formal talks on it going. We do have a building fund that we will need to access partial resources from to accomplish any expansion that we may decide on.

Many great ideas came out of the last meeting about several different topics. At the risk of repeating them to those that attended, I will do so for the rest of the membership only because they are of interest to many.

In a discussion about the impact of urban storm water on our surface water. several ideas were shared on how we could begin a process of educating and motivating the general public on the role they can play in the improvement of impervious surface run-off. I shared with the group that I have been in meetings with, the 3M River Restoration Action Team, on this subject. I conveyed to them that there was a Minnesota River basin-wide initiative that I was intimately involved in implementing with several partners including the 37 County Minnesota River Board, the Minnesota River Basin Data Center, Friends of the Minnesota Valley, and CCMR. The name of the program is Community Clean Ups for water quality. There have been 3 pilot projects completed in Minnesota basin communities. Much was learned from these and the program is now ready to be rolled out in all of our watershed communities in a coordinated effort. Much of this is in the beginning phases right now. A strategy for doing the projects is to have one or more local adopter's (much like the Adopt-A-River program) to spearhead and coordinate a day of community clean up. The program involves distributing door hangers prior to a collection day, which informs the general public on what it is they can do year round to help reduce phosphorus and other pollutants in our surface water and what they need to do before a day of collection. Other program enhancement ideas were brought up at our last meeting. A suggestion that a 15 minute video could be developed for public access TV that explained about impervious urban run-off and the Community Clean-Up program was brought up. Also it was suggested that local radio access could be used to inform the public during the most sensitive of times for run-off pollution (early Spring, late Fall). A strengthening and clarification of ordinances affecting the surface water runoff was discussed as an option for consideration. Also mentioned was that public utility bills would be another way to inform the public and solicit participation in the Community Clean Up program. It was noted that further discussions with the 3M team would follow and that NUASF would help cooridinate and carry out a project in New Ulm next year.

Our meeting included a planning session (brainstorming) for Riverside Park in New Ulm. We received a plethora of outstanding ideas for enhancement President continued on page 3.


