
# Waubay, South Dakota fishing trip

The cost to rent his houses has increased this year due to higher cost of propane to keep them warm. It will cost \$14.60 per day per person for two holes, which is still pretty reasonable. The cost for the hotel has also gone up, but only \$2.00 a night. Oh, by the way, we will be staying at the Bunkhouse again.

I know a lot of you bought yearly fishing licenses last year and they will still be good this year.

When are we going? Well, we decided to go a little earlier this year and try to avoid the coldest weekend of the year. The dates we picked are January 5th through the 8th. Also if anyone wants to do some fishing on
