Where did winter go? Not only has it been unseasonably warm but the lack of sunshine has caused us to start the aeration system. Oxygen levels had dropped to 8 parts per million near the top of the water and as little as 4 parts near the bottom and we didn't like the direction it was headed so we made the decision to fire things up. We just turned it on yesterday (January 8<sup>th</sup>) after we had put all the signs out and drilled some holes to get it started. Many thanks to the guys who helped. All of the helixers are working well and Mike is putting new belts on the pump tomorrow. There is about 4 inches of good ice and 3 or 4 that is white ice, so walking is the safest right at this time. 4 wheelers or snowmobiles should be alright, but I would stay a healthy distance away from the system with those. It is staying below the freezing mark most of every day so we are not loosing ground with the ice and we should be able to get the houses out shortly. It is very frustrating when you want to use the fish houses and there is not enough ice to support them. We all remember vividly fishing out the houses several times a couple years ago and no one wants to do that again. I suppose we could put pontoons on the sides of the house in case of that. Ooofda!

We had 58 people at the last meeting and that's great, it does appear to be the trend. However feeding everyone is becoming a challenge. We will always have food for everyone at each meeting, but the board of directors has decided to adopt a policy for lessening the pressure on the club a bit. If you want to share something that you have made for a meeting, by all means don't hesitate to bring it. Soups, stews, kraut, sausage, cheese, chips and salsa or whatever is all acceptable and will help immensely in feeding the masses.

We do have steaks for the grille at this meeting coming from Montana via Eric Olson so that will be a treat to look forward to. I recently had the pleasure of meeting with U.S. Congressmen Mark Kennedy and his staff along with other NGO's and the USFWS to strategize on next steps for a bill that he is sponsoring in the U.S. House. It's called the Wetland Loan Act or popularly called the Duck Stamp Loan Act. It is filed under HR 4315 and can be referred to as such. If you wish to write our various congressmen in support you can do so by referring to the number and stating that you are in support of the amendments to the current act. If enacted Minnesota will be able to access up to ten years of projected duck stamp funds to do projects now while land values are still within reason. This would translate into about 150 million dollars to use today for projects that may not be doable in 5 years due to rising land values. We will be informed of a sponsor in the Senate shortly and have a number to refer to as well, stay tuned.

You will want to mark your calendars now for participation in the Rally for Ducks, Wetlands, and Clean Water at the Capitol on Sat. April 22<sup>nd</sup> (Earth Day). We will again be taking a bus and we will need a much better showing at this year's event. We obviously didn't drive it home enough previously because we got nothing more than lip service from any of our elected officials in this regards last year. Maybe they will be a little more responsive in an election year. hmmm.

If you are a member with good memory on our history and are willing to share remembrances, join us on Thursday January 19<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM at the Club Office to help us begin to put together the story. If you want to just listen in or help piece it together as we talk, please come we will need a lot of people cooperating to pull this one off.
