Annual Community Clean Up

About thirty members of the NUASF and 3M Rats met at Riverside Park on April 14th to help with our annual community clean up. The object of the project is to gather leaves and grass before they can get into the storm sewer system and eventually the Minnesota River. We picked up and delivered 238 bags to the com-

post site. That calculates to a reduction of over 47 lbs of phosphorus getting into the river and equates to a \$23,000 reduction of dollars used to take phosphorus out of our waste water system. Scott is still receiving cards; we placed in the Journal, from citizens that took their own leaves to the compost site. So these totals are actually a

lot larger. We also collected about 20 tires. A huge thank you must go out to Royal Tire. They took the tires off our hands and the cost incurred to dispose of them, probably well over \$200.00. Thank you to every one that helped with the clean up, it is one of our most important environmental projects of the year.

Fay A. Sparlin Obituary

Fay Arlene (Haverland) Sparlin was born on August 4, 1928 to a farming family in Colfax, North Dakota, the second of nine children. Her family left North Dakota for Gemmell, MN early in Fay's life and remained there for the rest of her childhood. Fay graduated from Northome High School in 1945, attended Maryville State College and became a school teacher in the Minot, ND area. Fay returned to Minnesota where she met and married Stonewall Sparlin of Orth, MN in September of 1949. Fay and Stonewall eventually settled in Grand Rapids where they raised their family. Stonewall passed away in 1989 and Fay continued to live in their home for 56 years, where she spent her final days.

Fay did not resume teaching in Minnesota, opting to stay home during the early years of her marriage. Fay became a clerk for the municipal liquor stores in Grand Rapids in the early seventies until her retirement. In 1983, Fay returned to her farming roots and founded

Itasea Tree Specialists with her son, Scott, at Orth, MN. She continued to be active on the tree farm the rest of her life and took great pleasure crafting the many seasonal creations that were distributed throughout the state at Christmas time.

It is difficult to accurately reflect the life of one so passionate in so few words. Fay was deeply spiritual and an active member of the Unitarian Chapel of Grand Rapids for over 40 years. She was a student of all things historical and philosophical, with an extensive reference library. Fay was an avid reader and observer of current events. A lifelong member of the DFL party, Fay was not afraid to share her opinions of others. Fay felt a deep and abiding connection to the land and nature, evident in her many gardens and plantings and her love of the tree farm. Fay preferred wild flowers over roses and recycling was her way of life. In keeping with her spirit of conservation, Fay was a second hand retail expert and referred to the area thrift stores as her "Boutiques." enjoyed travel, often vacationing with her sisters or spending time with her daughter, (fail, in NY.

Conservationist, scholar, humanitarian, seamstress, carpenter, cook, spiritual mentor, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, and keeper of the hearth. The earth is a better place for her living here.

Her parents, Adolph and Adeline Haverland, her husband Stonewall, two brothers, John in infancy and Adolph "Bud" Haverland, a sister, Mary Varin and her beloved

niece Loretta Dunnell, preceded her in death.

Survivors include her children, Scott (Patricia) Sparlin of New Ulm, MN and Gail (Glenn Gray) Sparlin of Schenectady NY, grandchildren, Mathew Sparlin of New Ulm, MN, and Cecelia Gray of Schenectady, NY, sister Lois Shull of Northome, MN, Audrey (Jim) Fish of Blaine, MN, Joan (Ron) Hegwood of Conyers, GA, Ann (Richard) Lindcen of Andover, MN, and Virginia (Michael) Ballestrazze of Oakdale, MN and many nieces and nephews.

There will be an open house celebration from 3:30 p.m. until the 5:30 p.m. memorial service on Saturday, May 19, 2007 in the Grand Rapids Masonic Lodge - 2515 E. Highway 2, Grand Rapids.


Our scholarship fund has achieved a goal we've been working on since its inception. We now have a \$10,000 CD @ 5% so it can virtually be self-sustaining.
