sincere effort to engage the angling and hunting public to discuss it rationally in a open forum and then try to come up with some answers that go beyond some of the knee jerk ones like global warming and a declining population of available young hunters and anglers. That certainly might be part of the equation but it ain't the whole story by a long shot. This is a big deal and if we don't get a handle on it and simplify things for people, they are going to drop out in more and more significant numbers and the cost of angling will continue to rise to support the work force it takes to manage the resource to the degree that it needs to managed. The last thing we need is to be patted on the head, told it's under control, we are not scientists, everything is fine and not to concern ourselves about things we couldn't possibly understand.
