# Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment Passes

The Clean Water, Land and Legacy amendment recently passed by the voters of Minnesota affirms what many of us already suspected and have experienced first hand in our work with natural resources here in the Minnesota River Basin. The vote margin in favor of the amendment clearly displays that residents are genuinely concerned about the future of our natural resources and in particular our surface water. Here in the Minnesota River Watershed which covers two fifths of Minnesota's land mass, we have witnessed these genuine concerns over the past two decades. After engaging residents from all walks of life in this part of the State, it became apparent to us most people really did care. After a brief period of denial and dismay with the results from extensive scientific testing of our surface water and the subsequent realization of the significantly degraded condition which existed, people began to assert that deep down they wanted to fix the problem. Having said that, it comes as no surprise to me that the people of Minnesota possess and have demonstrated with this vote a deep sense of pride in ones place. After an exeruciatingly long period of prodding the legislature to allow residents a vote on the amendment, the people had finally been given their rightful voice. It is my humble observation that this sends a clear message to our elected officials at all levels of Government as to where a clear majority of Minnesotan's stand in this regard. I take great pride in a State that has by its own initiative allowed the democratic process a chance to play out. Even greater so, I am proud that I live in a State that values its natural and cultural heritage enough to realize that it needs secure funding to face the real and significant challenges that loom on the horizon.
