E.E. MECKLENBURG ENVIRONMENTAL SCHOLARSHIP

Four students to receive scholarhip

This year the committee for the New Ulm Area Sport Fishermen (NUASF) EE Mecklenburg Environmental Scholarship chose four area students to receive \$500 each; bringing the total dollars awarded since the scholarship was formed to \$8,250.

As most members know, Earl Mecklenburg was the father of one of our longtime members, Dave Mecklenburg. In the fall of 2000, Dave's family created a scholarship to honor Earl's memory and asked our club to be a co-sponsor. Each year the Mecklenburg family makes a sizable donation to the scholarship fund, which our club, in turn, has decided to match. The fund also receives various donations throughout the year, as well as \$5 from generous club members when they renew their memberships.

Two of our recipients this year were from New Ulm Public High School. \$500 was awarded to John Vranich, the son of Steve and Tracie Vranich. John has loved all forms of nature since he was very young. He credits his grandmother for sparking his interest, because he loved watching her feed birds at her house. As a result, he remembers

spending countless hours paging through a field guide trying to learn about as many birds as he could. His life list for spotting birds now numbers 284 species. John's bird watching "hobby" made him more aware of the environment and the many consequences of negative ecological practices. Wanting to make a difference, he joined the Putting Green, which is an environmental organization with the goal, "To educate and inspire people to make informed choices for a healthier planet." He participates in their EcoPreneur Program, which teaches students how to use the "triple bottom line" in making business decisions;

that is, looking at the economic, environmental, and social impacts of business decisions. John plans to study environmental sciences and engineering at the college of St. Olaf.

Adam Hoffmann is the other \$500 recipient from New Ulm Public High School. He is the son of Jeff and Cindy Hoffmann. Growing up on a farm, Adam developed a

He has raised and released many pheasants and mallard ducks.
