Crank bait index

The terminal connection: 1) Pass at least 6-inches of line through the eye of the lure and make a circle with the tag end; 2) Bring the tag end around the double length and through the circle six times; 3) Moisten and pull snugly after the last turn; 4) Clip the tag end and you have a knot that can give you 90 to 100 percent strength as a terminal connector. This is a very versatile knot, easy to tie, even in the dark, and may well be the sexiest thing around to enhance your fishing experience. (Do you know what this fishing knot is called? Bring your guess to the meeting.)
