Dennis Fredrickson, gave an update on the legislative goings-on in relation to the Legacy Amendment, and the environment in general, at the NUASF meeting on October 1st. After fielding questions from the members present, Denny introduced Peter Sorensen, a University of Minnesota biologist, who gave a very interesting presentation on the "Biology and Control of the Common Carp." What follows are highlights, quotations, and power-points from Dr.

Sorensen's remarkable lecture on a seemingly unremarkable topic. The world according to Carp . . .

~The common carp is a remarkable fish.

~A river fish from central Asia that has conquered the world.

~The spread of carp has been perpetuated by man, from Roman times, to the Catholic church, to the U.S. Fish Commission, promoted as "Carp Culture".



~Carp were introduced to the USA in 1877: 345 adult carp were brought from Germany; were propagated in ponds for 2 years; and from 1879-1895, the entire country was stocked ~Carp have come to dominate the fish biomass in many Midwestern lakes and rivers.

~In abundance, carp have devastating effects on water, plant, and fish quality.



~Above certain densities, carp become damaging, leading to algae bloom, shading, and aquatic plant decline. ~Present control techniques, which include *unselective* removal and exclusion, have been proven to be expensive and unsustainable, and the

> results are almost always shortlived.

~Something better: Integrated control? This is a systematic approach which targets biological attributes of an unwanted species to bring it under control in an ecologically and economically sustainable manner.

~Carp in your watershed? Consider this: Carp are very damaging to the environment; carp are complex and difficult to deal with; solutions are emerging for certain situations; targeting and science are the key; there are different possible solutions for different particular locations; and, as always, more research is needed.  $\sim$  For answers to some of your basic questions, Why so many carp? What is their life history? Where do adult carp go? (B&L Bar?) How and where do they spawn? When and where are they born? How do they winter? Why are there so many carp in certain lake and river systems? please do your own research, contact Peter Sorensen directly, or contact the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources.


