As most members know, Earl Mecklenburg was the father of longtime member, Dave Mecklenburg. To honor Earl's memory, in the fall of 2000, Dave's family created the scholarship for graduating high school students planning on pursuing a career in the environmental field. That same year, the NUASF club came on board as a co-sponsor.

The first of the two recipients is Jeff

Jerve, a graduate of Montevideo High School and the son of Ron and Gail Jerve. While in school, Jeff was involved in football, basketball, and track.
