High Island Lake Reclamation on Track

FMV. Past President NUASF Much planning and a lot of work have gone into the reclamation of High Island Lake this past year. Friends of High Island along with their numerous partners completed projects designed to improve water quality in the impaired High Island Watershed. The projects were undertaken in tributaries to High Island Lake, High Island Creek and the lake itself which ultimately drains the Minnesota River. Numerous best management practices have also been adopted with the help of the Clean Water Partnership which is funded by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.

In May over 25 volunteers participated in a barley straw project which was both experimental and effective in reducing phosphorus. Using a Christmas tree bailer, long (15-20 ft.) bales of barley straw were placed in streams that drain to High Island Lake. This process has been effective in reducing phosphorus and algae in other parts of the United States, Great Britain and in Minnesota as well. Monitoring samples were taken throughout the summer and fall by Joel Wurscher which showed a localized significant reduction of phosphorus. The project has been a learning experience for all and will be fine tuned to make it even more effective this next year.

A number of meetings with both government and non-government entities during the past year have resulted in the creation of an excellent road map for moving forward with the lake draw down. After many discussions and numerous communications all parties are now on the same page. The situation now exists which will allow for a timely and most effective draw down this year and into the future years when and if needed. The plans include modifications to the outlet of the lake along with the control structure. This will allow for a thorough draw down and an accelerated water flow coming from the lake during any planned draw down event. Some of the modifications are in place now and some will be completed this winter. They are being funded by *Friends of* High Island from donations received during our Mid-Winter Bash fund raiser and from our many partners as well. Subsequently if the lake experiences a

good freeze out this winter, walleye fry will be put in the lake and the water control structure will be utilized to return the lake levels back to normal some time in spring 2010.

This fall another rain garden was constructed in the city of New Auburn by This brings the total to 7 that have been constructed in the city over the past 3 years. This upcoming year a large rain garden is being planned for construction on the north end of town with a completion date slated for late summer. New

Auburn intends to have the entire community's storm water system consist of rain gardens instead of the more conventional curb and gutter that most cities have. This will further help the lake recover and ensure clean runoff to the lake from the city of New Auburn into the future.
