- *Area Lakes and Rivers Report: Dixon Lake—very good with over 300 fish caught. Minnesota River—7 to 10 pound walleyes being caught.
- *Clubhouse and Grounds Update: 4 of the 6 LP tanks that were stolen reappeared in the shed (empty) as mysteriously as they had disappeared . . .
- *Report from Scott E. Sparlin: High Island Lake—\$14,000.00 made at the fund raiser. An educational seminar on fishing, water quality and ecology will be conducted by Scott Sparlin and Ron Bolduan at Riverside Park in May for 4th, 5th, and 6th graders. New Auburn fish fry to be held February 27th. Barley testing report: very successful. It was suggested that NUASF look into a possible application on Clear Lake.

*Tony Miller newsletter advertising/advertisers: price of ads raised to \$20 for printed newsletter, \$10 for web-ads. Many ads are past due. Members volunteered to contact the past due accounts to ask for their continued support. High Banks, Dixon Lake, and Mankato Tent & Awning were given free NUASF memberships last year. 


