Official Minnesota State Dinner ingredients

ROON (roon) n. 1. A person possessed by extreme or insatiable desires for morel mushrooms. 2. A keeper of the secrets and the Order of the Roon. 3. One who is given to luxury and sensual pleasures. 4. *Used in cooking, an equivalent measurement of dried, frozen or fresh morel mushrooms . . .

... which leads us to the ingredients of the "Official Minnesota State Dinner." So, in hopes that you have hooked some *walleyed pike and hunted down some *morchella esculenta—Bon Appetit! (adapted from the book, The Morel Mushroom: A Guide for Roons, by John Ratzloff; Voyageur Press, 1990)

- 4 ounces wild rice
- 4 cups lightly salted water
- 3 tablespoons butter

- 1 medium onion, chopped
- * 1 roon morels
- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup cornmeal
- 4 tablespoons corn oil
- *4 walleye fillets
- 1 lemon, wedged
- 1 tablespoon parsley, minced salt and pepper

Cook the wild rice per instructions Saute the onion until it turns clear Add the morels and sauté for four minutes. Add cooked wild rice, mix, set aside in warm oven Mix flour and cornmeal together in a bowl and season to taste with salt and pepper. In a large cast-iron skillet, heat 2 tablespoons of oil over medium-high heat

Dredge walleye fillets in flour/meal mixture, place, two at a time, into skillet.

Cook fillets according to your experience, place on warm platter, set aside in warm oven.

Prepare the plates by placing a golden brown walleye fillet on each,



*Secretary's and Treasurer's Reports were approved unanimously by the members present.

*There were no "Fish Tales" reported for the Area Lakes and Rivers Report section of this newsletter.

*Clubhouse and Grounds Update: Sign up for mowing! Change the lock on the mowershed back to the old one so members can use it. Don "Lefty" Brand donated some old fishing poles and tackle to the club. Thank you, Don! No other "old" business reported at this time, but we must continue our crusade to help stamp-out Beatle-haircuts on athletes.
