Regional River History and Information Center

The Regional River History and Information Center (RRHIC), a program under CCMR, is housed in the Franklin School building which was built in 1892. It is located in Riverside Park at Center & South Front Streets.

Franklin School became the headquarters for the Coalition for a Clean Minnesota River organization in 2004 under the directorship of Scott Sparlin. In keeping with the atmosphere of a school, he established the RRHIC program. In 2005, as a volunteer, I became an assis-



tant, creating displays and researching stories of travel, recreation, the button industry and fishing on the Minnesota River.

RRHIC Curator, Ron Bolduan, has on display a large amount of his collection of artifacts he has found along the regional rivers; some of which is animal pelts, turtle shells, animal skulls, and the working of beavers. There are thousands of years old bones including a skull and horns of a Bison Accendentalis which came to North America before the Ice Age. Donation of items have come from many people, such as beaver hides, antique fishing lures, and an Indian axe

head dating from 700 to 1100 years old.

RRHIC is a hands-on museum of artifacts enjoyed by people of all ages. Children like to pick up and/or feel most of the objects and they also ask interesting questions or contribute information.

This past year, Ron launched a new program: "River Ranger", to teach children about the rivers through personal experiences.

RRHIC hours are Tue. - Fri. 11 a.m. - 3p.m. June through August and noon - 4 p.m. weekends May through October. For appointment: bold@newulmtel.net

- *Area Lakes and Rivers Report: Minnesota River "has been good," as has Hagemen Dam. *Clubhouse and Grounds Update: Painting and Social Hour on September 16th, starting at 5:00 p.m. at the clubhouse. Kim Olson will "supply the supplies." Email reminder sent out to members
- *Jim Hulke will keep us advised as to the "fixability" of the lawn mower.
- *Don Luther took boat motor back to repair a carburetor problem.
- *Ron Ludewig reported on the aeration pumps at Clear Lake. Parts may need replacing and some may no longer be available. New pump estimated at \$2500. Motion made and carried to purchase new pump, if necessary.
- *Orin Schultz trimmed the tree above the club fish-house (also in need of a paint-job before the snow flies) stored at his place.
