He really liked that fact that we led the way on many of those issues. I know that because he would tell me after the meetings that I needed to keep on the guys about the environment and the issues that were out

there.

The jokes Erv told were way beyond funny and clever. George would really get a gleam in his eye when he was telling one and that smile would come over his face at the punch line. It is a look I will treasure all the rest of my days when I think of him.

Erv loved playing music and many of you don't know this, but he was a very accomplished concertina and piano player. When his buddy Lloyd who also plays the button accordion would get together on the lake at the NUASF Winter Fishing Contest with a bunch of the rest of the NUASF choral group it was a pure hoot. Throw in some of Pete's shine and a couple of cold Schell's or Grain Belt (for Pete) and all was right with the world. The international headquarters of NUASF will never be quite the same without Poor George. So Ervie here's to you buddy, remember we are only tasting, we will save the real serious stuff for when we meet again.

Hope to see you at the next meeting!!


### Volunteers needed for Riverblast

\*AC fixed by Barry Z., parts and labor at no cost to club. Pat R. will talk to John R. about mowing. John's retired and "has nothing to do," said Pat. Elmer Epke has donated the \$160 from the pork chop feed to the club. Thank you, Elmer! Tony M. had a great ad in the paper, and two more are on the way.

\*Ice Castle Raffle Report: NUASF will be selling tickets at Riverblast, will need volunteers there. Jason K. is working on getting the logos done. It was suggested that we run the Ice Castle as a unit in the Parade of Lights during the holidays.
