It is because of these donations, large or small, that the fund continues to grow and has allowed the scholarship committee to award a total of \$12,750 to area students since it's formation. In fact, for the first time since the scholarship began, the committee has decided to offer the recipients an additional opportunity. When they declare their major, if the current recipients can show proof that it is in the environmental field, then they will be eligible to re-apply for more scholarship money.
