NUASF E.E.Mecklenburg Environmental Scholarship recipients for 2012

This is the 12th year that the New Ulm Area Sport Fishermen (NUASF) E.E. Mecklenburg Environmental Scholarship committee has awarded

scholarships to high school graduates.
For those of you that need a little background: Earl Mecklenburg was the father of Dave Mecklenburg, a longtime member of the club. Earl grew up on a farm in Milford Township and moved to New Ulm as an adult. In addition to his family and many friends, education and the environment were very important to him. Earl loved to read and always stressed to his family the value of a good education. During his lifetime, he enjoyed being outdoors, whether it was for fishing, hunting, or just observing nature. To honor Earl's memory, his family created a scholarship for high school graduates pursuing a career in the environmental field. Since the NUASF club is involved in many activities supporting environmental causes, the Mecklenburg family asked the club to

co-sponsor the scholarship.
This year the committee awarded two \$750 scholarships and two \$500 scholar-

Catarina Gronau, a graduate from Cedar Mountain High School in Morgan,

was awarded a \$500 scholarship. Her parents are Mark and Julie Hartle and Wade and Cindi Gronau. She grew up in a large family and says she loves anything to do with water, animals, sports, and science. Catarina was an honor


student and was active

in dance, basketball, softball, band, choir, FFA, school council, and more. As a

member of 4-H, Catarina participated in various activities, such as road ditch clean-ups, building and placing bird houses in correct nesting places, and vol-unteering at the Redwood Area Animal Shelter/Humane Society. She also took mission trips to New Orleans, the Quad Cities, and Daytona Beach to help repair and clean destroyed communities Catarina plans to study Marine Biology at Southwest Minnesota State University.
The other \$500 recipient is Rachel

Ayer. She is the daughter of Dave and

Ann Ayer and graduated from New Ulm Public High School. Rachel loves to read and also to watch movies about nature. She is fascinated with biology and spent many hours before and after school in the Biology classroom volunteering to help

The scholarship committee awarded \$750 to John Christensen. He graduated from Comfrey Public High School and is the son of Steve and Becky Christensen. John was born in Newcastle, Wyoming, where his love of nature began. Throughout his school years, he participated in football, baseball, and basketball, while earning high academic honors. He did volunteer work for several com-

munity projects, such as planting sod and helping with the maintenance on the baseball field, building

an artificial snow fence, building duck houses and planting them on various ponds, and planting trees around the school. John likes to spend leisure time fishing and hunting

and is a keen sportsman. This summer, John will be working at a Fish Hatchery

in Spearfish, South Dakota. In the Fall, he plans to attend South Dakota State University and study Wildlife and Fisheries Sciences.

\$750 was also awarded to Tim DeGrood, a graduate of Faribault High School. Tim is the son of Mike and Ann

DeGrood and the nephew of club member Jeff Nielsen. Tim says his love of the outdoors began while spending time with his dad hunting, fishing, and going on nature walks. He is an active member of the



Faribault Archery Club, where he has been shooting bow since he was nine years old. Tim competed in at least five Minnesota State Archery Association indoor meets, where he placed first in the championship round four years and took third place one year. He also took first place in a winter animal league for two years at the local club. Another sport Tim enjoys competing in is Bow Fishing. He took third place in the Minnesota State Bow Fishing Tournament held in Faribault. As a Boy Scout, Tim was involved in many projects, such as building a special bird house to help bring back habitat for the native Chimney Swift and attending Woodie Camp where Swift and attending Woodie Camp where he learned about aquatic and wetland biology and banded wood ducks and mallards for scientific study.
