NUASF E.E. MECKLENBURG ENVIRONMENTAL SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS FOR 2015

This is the 15th year that the New Ulm Area Sport Fishermen (NUASF) E.E. Mecklenburg Environmental Scholarship committee has awarded scholarships to high school graduates.

For those of you that need a little background: Earl Mecklenburg was the father of Dave Mecklenburg, a longtime member of the club. Earl grew up on a farm in Milford Township and moved to New Ulm as an adult. In addition to his family and many friends, education and the environment were very important to him. Earl loved to read and always stressed to his family the value of a good education. During his lifetime, he enjoyed being outdoors, whether it was for fishing, hunting, or just observing nature. To honor Earl's memory, his family created a scholarship for high school graduates pursuing a career in the environmental field. Since the NUASF club is involved in many activities supporting environmental causes, the Mecklenburg family asked the club to cosponsor the scholarship.

This year the committee awarded one \$1,000 scholarship, one \$600 scholarship and two \$300 scholarships.

Aaron Pietsch, a graduate from Minnesota Valley Lutheran High School, was awarded the **\$1,000** scholarship. His parents are Timothy and Debra Pietsch of New Ulm. Aaron credits his father for his interest in nature. He loves to go fishing with him on the

Minnesota River by his house. Aaron has also developed a passion for bird watching. He started observing birds in 8th grade and continues to this day. For Aaron, it was not enough to just enjoy the outside world; he also wanted to learn more about it. He did research through books and in articles online to find answers to his questions. He made friends with a biology professor at Bethany Lutheran College, Chad Heins, because they shared a mutual interest in birds. Sometimes they even go bird watching together. Aaron has been involved in numerous environmental activities, such as: Adopt a Highway cleanup, Judson Bottom Road River cleanup, mapped and navigated points at Flandrau State Park with the Minnesota National Guard, submitted data to E-Bird (a website that tracks migration dates and behaviors of birds), and conducted and reported water quality tests on the Minnesota River for the World Water Monitoring Challenge. He is also a member of the Minnesota Ornithologists Union and a National Audobon Society Backyard Bird Count volunteer. Aaron will be attending the University of Minnesota-Mpls to study environmental engineering. He hopes to find sustainable solutions for our changing environmental needs.

\$600 was awarded to **Lindsay Miller**, the daughter of Kevin and Brenda Miller and a graduate of GFW High School. Lindsay grew up on a swine and crop farm south of

Brownton where she helps her parents and two brothers raise pigs from farrow to finish. She says her parents gave her a strong work ethic and always stressed the importance of an education. Lindsay was active in her church and community throughout her school years. She participated in various sports and was a member of the FFA, 4-H, National Honor Society and Student Council. While on her church youth group trips to the Grand Tetons of Wyoming and the Boundary Water Canoe Area in Northern Minnesota, her advisor said that Lindsay was a great role model. She loved being outside, even if it meant carrying a 50 lb backpack at 12,000 ft elevation or a canoe in ankle-deep mud. Lindsay loves science, animals, and the outside world. She plans to study Biology at South Dakota State University.

The first of the **\$300** scholarship winners is Andrew Fischer, a graduate from Cedar Mountain High School, and the son of Sheila Fisher-Birkemeyer. During his school years, Andrew was involved in basketball, golf, trap shooting and helping to set up duck houses. He is a member of the Wild Turkey Federation, North American Hunting Club and FFA. Andrew loves to go hunting, hiking, camping and enjoys water sports, but his favorite thing is to go fishing. Andrew says his Grandpa had a bait shop in Franklin and taught him a wide variety of fishing techniques. They must have paid off, because Andrew was featured in the Outdoor News publication for one of his trophy Bass catches. Andrew hopes to earn a degree in Natural Resources at the University of Stevens Point, Wisconsin.
