NUASF Mecklenburg Environmental Scholarsip Recipients for 2016

Four students were chosen as recipients of the New Ulm Area Sport Fishermen (NUASF) E.E. Mecklenburg Environmental Scholarship for 2016.

Although it is in its 16 th year, there are always new club members that may not know the origins of thescholarship. So, every year we give a brief history: Earl Mecklenburg was the father of club member, Dave Mecklenburg. Earl grew up on a farm in Milford Township and moved to New Ulm as an adult. In addition to his family and many friends, education and the environment were very important to him. To honor Earl's memory, in the fall of 2000, Dave's family created the scholarship for graduating high school students planning on pursuing a career in the environmental field. Since the NUASF club is involved in many activities supporting environmental causes, the Mecklenburg family asked the club if they would like to be co-sponsors of the scholarship and they agreed.

This year the committee awarded four \$500 scholarships.

\$500 was awarded to Mariah Vogel, a graduate of

New Ulm Public High School. The daughter of Amos and Marianne Vogel, Mariah grew up on a farm near Morgan. In addition to the many activities that she was involved in; such as basketball, volleyball, choir and FFA, as well as working on a dairy farm, Mariah also volunteered her time for community service by cleaning ditches



and playing piano at church and care centers. She served as an officer for the local and regional FFA chapters, earned a Certificatee of Merit for Special Academic Recognition from the Optimist Club, and was crowned the Brown County Dairy Princess. Throughout all of these commitments, she maintained an exceptional grade point average. Mariah will be attending the University of Wisconsin – Steven's Point and is interested in obtaining a degree

in Environmental Law Enforcement in order to become a Game Warden or Park Ranger.

The second \$500 award went to Gabe Knowles, a graduate of Cathedral High School. He is the son

of Terry and Frani Knowles of New Ulm. A three-sport athlete (he has been recruited to play Division –I baseball at the U of M, Gabe still found time to excel academically at school and to enjoy other outside activities, such as fishing



and hunting. He will be continuing his education at the University of Minnesota at the school of Food,Agriculture, and Natural Resource Sciences.

Elias Berdan is the third of the four \$500 recipients. He is the son of Jeff and Jill Berdan and is also a graduate of Cathedral High School. Elias, aka EJ, had a reputation at school for being an enthusi-

astic volunteer no matter what the job entailed. His science teacher referred to him as a "leader by example." EJ has had a love of fishing ever since his dad introduced him to the sport at age two. In addition to fishing, EJ also enjoys hunting and just



observing the natural world around him. He will be attending the University of Minnesota to study Fisheries and Wildlife.

Our fourth \$500 award went to Kyle Strate. He is the son of Brian and Michelle Strate and a graduate of St. Mary's High School in Sleepy Eye. Growing up on a farm helped develop Kyle's love of nature. Kyle is concerned about climate change and global warming and is an advocate for renewable energy and the reduction of the use of fossåil fuels. Kyle has been noted for his superb academic rigor and personal aptitude. One of his teachers had

this to say, "He regularly asks questions, makes connections, and synthesizes details even while

learning new material." Kyle plans on studying biology at the University of Minnesota – Duluth.

This is also the second year that the scholarship committee gave a \$500 award to a student selected by the Minnesota Chapter of the American Fisheries



Society. The AFS chose Loranzie Samuel Rodgers, Jr., and added an additional \$200 to the scholarship award. Loranzie is a Junior Biology major at the University of Minnesota – Duluth. (Contact Scott Sparlin for more details regarding this scholarship and recipient.)

The Scholarship Committee wishes to congratulate these fine young students and offer best wishes for their future education and environmental pursuits.
