

NUASF E.E. MECKLENBURG ENVIRONMENTAL SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS FOR 2018

This is the 18th year that the New Ulm Area Sport Fishermen E.E. Mecklenburg Environmental Scholarship has awarded scholarships to area students and the 4th year that an award was given to a student chosen by the Minnesota Chapter of the American Fisheries Society (AFS). The committee also gave out two additional awards to past recipients that re-applied after declaring a major in the environmental field.

First, a brief history: To honor the memory of Earl Mecklenburg, who was the father of longtime club member. Dave Mecklenburg, his family created a scholarship for graduating high school students planning on pursuing a career in the environmental field. Since the NUASF club had been involved in many activities supporting environmental causes, the family then asked the club members if they would like to be co-sponsors of the scholarship. They agreed and came on board.

This year the committee awarded four \$600 scholarships and three \$200 scholarships to area students.



The first of the \$600 recipients is Erica Bock, a graduate from Cedar Mountain High School. Her parents are Nancy Nelson-Bock and Dean Bock. Erica was active in many sports and did volunteer work with various community organizations. She feels that her involvement with sports taught her the qualities of respect,

discipline, and dedication. Erica was raised on a farm by Franklin where she became passionate about everything outdoors. She believes in practicing farming techniques that will help prevent soil erosion and protect the water supply. She is interested in Biological Systems Engineering and hopes to use her degree to make the Earth a greener place by finding environmentally friendly solutions to meet society's needs. She will be attending the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities this fall.



The second of the \$600 recipients is Carter Brinkman. He graduated from Sleepy Eye Public High School and is the son of Dean and Sandy Brinkman, While in school, Carter earned several awards in baseball and other school activities, participated in various volunteer projects, placed 3rd in a Bass Tournament, and was a Fish and

Wildlife FFA Team State qualifier. Carter is a very industrious young man. In addition to all of this, he also started his own

business mowing, mulching and doing leaf cleanup for several clients and held an after-school job at Mark Thomas Company. Carter credits his parents for instilling a strong sense of responsibility and the importance of being a caring and dedicated person. His future goal is to attend Winona State University and major in Environmental Science and/or Geo-science.



The third \$600 recipient is Zachary Schumacher. He is the son of Ken and JoAnn Schumacher and is a graduate of Sleepy Eye St. Mary's. Outside of school, when Zach wasn't working on his uncles' farms, he was usually fishing or hunting. Clean water is important to Zach and that is why he joined the River Watch Program

that was created by the two Sleepy Eve high schools. In this program. Zach was able to get hands on training to check pH and nitrogen levels in the local rivers, studying how and why the levels would rise or fall. Hunting has also influenced him to learn about the population sizes of different species of animals. Zach is enrolled in the Fisheries and Wildlife program at Valley City State University in North Dakota.



The fourth \$600 recipient is Thorild Nelson, a graduate from Nicollet Public High School. Tory, as he is known by his family and friends, is the son of Karlen Nelson and Michele Metzger, and grew up on a farm near Nicollet. During high school, Tory participated in many school organizations and demonstrated his leadership

skills by being band president, captain of the football team, and supervisor for the strength program in weights. Among his many extra-curricular activities, Tory volunteered at the Nicollet Conservation Club making, placing, refilling, and taking data on duck nesting houses on Swan Lake. Carter is very interested in animals and plans to study Wildlife Biology at Bemidii State University.



The first of the \$200 recipients is Jacob Radloff. He graduated from New Ulm Public High School and is the son of Doug and Patricia Radloff. Jacob enjoys fishing, hunting, and doing farm field work. He was involved in various outdoor activities, such as CRP management. wood duck house building, and pond and lake
